School Response:

- The best way to support your child's learning at home is to hear them read and read to them on a regular basis this is key to their progress across the whole curriculum.
- You can also practise spelling red words and quick recall of number facts.
- Teachers will update links to websites on the Year Group pages to support the learning taking place in school.
- Children are welcome to carry out their own research / learning linked to their enquiry and share what they have learnt or done with their class; enquires are detailed on the school website.
- We plan to review and update the video resource centre (VRC) on the school's website, here you will find information detailing strategies for different areas of learning that can be used to support learning at home.
- There are numerous academic, social and emotional benefits to playing board and card games at home.
- Setting and administering homework provides an additional workload for teachers
 which the school is working to reduce; by updating the school's website with useful
 links, parents and children can access supportive materials to aid home learning.

7% parents expressed their desire to receive more information about their child's progress, in addition to the two parents' evenings and school report at the end of the year.
