








# What is a digraph?

A digraph is a cluster of two letters that when read together make one sound.

Your child has already explored the digraphs...

 <b>qu</b> qu Qu	 The queen is quite quiet. Right around the queen and way down her staff. Under the umbrella, up and down.	  <b>sh</b>	 Sherry shines her shoes.	  <b>ch</b>	 The chipmunk chooses cheese.	 <b>th</b> 	 Theo has a thimble on his thumb.	  <b>ng</b>	 Bring the king a ring.
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Over the next few weeks, your child will be learning the following **vowel** digraphs...

  <b>ai</b>	 Train in the rain.	  <b>ee</b>	 See the tree.	  <b>oa</b>	 Goat in a boat.
  <b>oo</b>	 Zoom to the moon.	  <b>oo</b>	 Look for a book.	  <b>ar</b>	 Start the car.


